Beyond the Hurt

The Program: Beyond the Hurt examines all types of harassment and bullying – personal, racial, sexual, and the abuse of power and authority

This workshop explores;

- how interpersonal power issues are played out among young people
 - what common issues are targeted by bullies
 - intervention and prevention issues, including in the law and through school policies
- how to respond to disclosures and what support services are available
- what impact harassing behavior has on young people
- proactive strategies for preventing harassment, abuse and bullying from occurring at individual, organizational, and community levels
- how to work with youth in developing risk—management strategies.

SPEAKERS BIO

Norm Jakubowski is the provincial manager of the RespectED program for the Red Cross. He has completed the training for Hearing the Hurt, an in depth, 27 course program dealing with the maltreatment of youth. He has also been trained in Restitution Self Discipline, Resolving Conflict Constructively, Leading by Example, and Excellent Management. Norm has a Bachelor of Education degree and has completed Post Graduate work in Educational Administration from the University of Regina. His undergraduate major field of study is sociology.

Norm retired as teacher and school administrator after 31 years. Among his most notable experiences was the creation of integrated learning centers for students with physical and intellectual challenges in two of his schools, the creation of a preschool program, and a published student leadership initiative.

Norm's passion to create safe environments for kids has taken him to facilitate in Nunavut, Calgary, Winnipeg, Vancouver, and across Saskatchewan. Norm works with many school divisions, the WHL, swim clubs, parks and recreation, universities, police, businesses, and youth sewing organizations.

On a personal note, Norm is married and has two daughters. Megan attends the U of S, I completing a Master Program in physiotherapy. Chelsea attends the U of R and is the Business Faculty. Norm's wife, Keri, is an instructor at SIAST.
